Luke 12:35-37 (ESV) "Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, and be like men [and women] who are waiting for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them."

Dressed for action...I imagine a public safety officer sleeping in her uniform, ready at a moment's notice to spring into action. I imagine an on-call nurse, dressed in his scrubs, tools of the trade at the ready, prepared to respond to crisis at any time.

Jesus does not speak these words from Luke's gospel for those who are particularly holy, or who serve in "full time ministry" (whatever that means). No, to Jesus, a disciple is a minister (servant) and a minister is a disciple. All disciples must heed the call to "stay dressed for action" and "keep your lamps burning." These metaphors imply a certain level of preparedness by the disciple. A disciple of Jesus will make a conscious effort to proactively prepare for service to the King and the Kingdom.

Of course, weekly worship with the people of God at Union plays a central role in our being "dressed for action." In addition, let me suggest two additional opportunities to help you "stay dressed for action" and to "keep your lamp burning."

Gather and learn. Take advantage of the Growth Group opportunities throughout the year. Toward that end, on March 13th, we will begin a 5-week Growth Group focused on deepening our understanding of our faith. The series, *I am Reformed and Why it Matters*, will help us dig below the surface of Christian basics. Together we will discover the Biblical foundations for our Reformed tradition and the distinct theological commitments that entails. Being Reformed is more than an academic concern. A Reformed commitment shapes everything from our prayer life and our worship, to our view of sin and redemption, and our understanding of our own calling to follow Jesus in day-to-day life. *I am Reformed and Why it Matters* will be held on Wednesdays during lent, March 13-April 10, from 7-8:30 p.m. in the Noble House. Our primary reading will be scripture, although additional reading will be recommended for those who wish to engage at a deeper level.

Travel and serve. Participate in mission outside the walls of Union Church. Toward that end, we will share in another joint summer mission opportunity with Mt. Pisgah Church. We will travel to Jackson, Mississippi, July 12th – 20th, and spend the week working with the John and Vera Mae Perkins Foundation (www.ivmpf.org). This will be an incredible week of learning about the civil rights era, practicing racial reconciliation, and serving with an at-risk neighborhood in Jackson, the state capital of Mississippi. I am excited for you to meet John Perkins and the folks who help run his foundation. John is an 86-year young civil rights leader...maybe the most important evangelical voice from that era. I guarantee that you will be inspired by his passionate and deeply Biblical message of Love and Justice. He writes,

We live in a broken world. How should we react? No doubt, some actions lessen the pain – and that's a good thing. But neither clenched fists nor helping hands alone will bring about the complete transformation that God wants. Only love can touch us at the point of our pain and begin to heal us and make us whole – individually and collectively. We are called to love...I often tell people that justice is a stewardship and economic issue, but truthfully, I think love is as well. Justice and love are intimately tied together in this way. Caring for those who have the least, loving our neighbors as we love ourselves, showing mercy to those around us – these are all issues of love, but they are also issues of justice. We cannot have true justice unless it is motivated by love, just as God's greatest act of justice, sending Jesus to die for us, was motivated by love.

Come travel with us to Jackson and experience "the whole Gospel for whole people!"

I hope you will stretch yourself and prayerfully consider the above as a helpful way to "stay dressed for action."

YOUTH MINISTRY (Grades 6-12)

30-Hour Famine: February 22-23, 2019 This event is an overnight lock-in at the church. Students go without food for 30-hours (we will have juice and water) and collect sponsors to raise funds for hunger all over the world. During the lock-in students participate in games and activities to help them understand the issue of hunger and why, as followers of Christ, we should be a part of the solution. Students can join the fundraising team and participate in the 30-hour famine, even if they are not able to participate in the over-night event.

Adventure Weekend Spring Retreat: April 12-14, 2019 @ Teen Quest. Annual Spring Retreat, open to all students (6th-12th grade). Cost \$120/student. Sign-up and payment is due by March 31, 2019.

High School Camp: July 8-12, 2019, Pigeon Forge, TN. This is the same conference the high school ministry went to last year. It was so good, we are planning on going back! This trip is only open to students who are in 9th-12th grade during the 2018-19 school year. The total cost of the trip is \$420/student. A \$100 deposit is due by February 25, 2019 to complete the sign-up. Final payments will be due by June 30, 2019.

Union Church Mission Trip: July 12 - 20, 2019, Jackson, MS. Information meeting: February 17th @ 12:30 in the Noble House. The cost of this trip will be \$500/participant. \$250 after fundraising. This trip is open to any student in 6th - 12th grade (this is a "multi-generational" whole church trip, so parents can sign-up too!). Due to the unique situation of our church mission trip starting as the high school trip ends, we are encouraging the high school students to take part in both trips, but we understand this might not be possible for every student. We will make transportation arrangements for students who can only take part in one trip.

Surf City: Aug 4 - 9, 2019, Silver Lake, MI. This trip is put on by the same organization that holds Laurelville Mud Weekends. This trip is only open to students in 6th - 8th grade during the 2018-19 school year. The total cost of the trip is \$420/student. A \$100 deposit is due by February 25, 2019 to complete the sign-up. Final payments will be due by July 28, 2019.

OUTREACH-MISSION TEAM

Vista Coffee Project - proceeds go to the global mission effort: Christ for the City International, El Salvador, San Salvador. The program will help to raise money to buy land and build their own, more permanent, facility.

Homeless Camp Ministry Project - Third Saturday of the month (Saturday, February 16), up to six(6) Union Church volunteers carpool from Union at 11:20a.m., or meet by 11:55a.m. at Hot Metal Bridge Faith Community Church at 2700 Jane Street, Southside, Pittsburgh. We prepare approximately 50 bagged lunches and deliver them to homeless camps around the city. Volunteers must be age 15+, wear heavy shoes/boots, prepared to hike on hilly trails, railroad tracks, and duck under bridges to serve in this outreach ministry. Hot Metal supplies a 'Care Closet' with clothes, shoes, gloves, toiletries, and camping supplies to give to folks living outside. 2019 service dates: February 16, June 15, August 17, October 19, and November 16

"The Table" - This outreach provides a meal through Hot Metal Bridge Faith Community missional ministry at 2700 Jane Street, Southside Pittsburgh: Union's Outreach-Mission Team and volunteers provide a meal for 85 to 100 people. We need volunteers to prepare each meal, bake brownies, cookies, or a dessert. We have 6-8 volunteers travel to the Southside to 'assemble' and serve the meal and assist in dishes & clean-up of the site. Some leave the church at 3:45p.m., or others just meet at The Table at 4:30p.m. and the meal is served at 5:30p.m., clean-up is done by 6:30p.m. 2019 Meal Service dates: March 26, July 25, September 24, October 29, and Thanksgiving Day, November 28. Pray, Cook, Bake, Serve, Clean, Care, Pray!

Pleasant Valley Men's Shelter at Northside Common Ministries- Union volunteers serve a meal to the 22 men residing at the shelter on the North Side, Pittsburgh. Leave Union around 6:30p.m. to head to the Northside. 2019 meal service dates: March 14, September 12, and November 14. ASH WEDNESDAY begins the season of the Church Year known as Lent, which begins forty days prior to Easter and is characterized by a focus on repentance, fasting, prayer, and the needs of others. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus—His suffering and His sacrifice, His life, death, burial and resurrection. The season of Lent reminds Christians of the words of Jesus in Matthew 16:24, "*If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.*" The way to Easter is the way of the cross.
